The judicial hopeful who requested a recount in the election for a Fulton County Superior Court judgeship ended up losing by more votes. Barry Garner, head of the county's Elections Department, said the recount showed that Clarence Johnson came out four more votes behind with 41,083. ## DeKalb

### 1½ acres near Emory to be preserved for park

One and a half acres will be preserved near Emory University as part of DeKalb County's park expansion initiative.

This week, the DeKalb County Commission signed an agreement to buy land at 1812 Ridgewood Drive N.E. in Atlanta for \$415,000. The property was listed at \$400,000 and the additional \$15,000 will cover title search, an environmental assessment and other closing costs, county spokesman Burke Brennan said.

It will also be used to bulldoze a garage on the property and turn the land into a small neighborhood park, Brennan said. The money is from the District 2 parks bond, which voters approved in 2001.
